MANUSCRIPTS: *The Ohio Journal of Science* considers manuscripts on any scientific subject from contributors anywhere. The manuscripts may be papers or notes on recent research or symposia on subjects of scientific interest. Every paper is critically reviewed by at least one and usually two reviewers, and is subject to the approval of the editorial staff. Two copies each, of manuscript and figures, should be submitted to the Editor. A carbon copy should be retained by the author for reading the galley proof. Galley proof and engraver's proof but not original manuscript will be sent to authors. See past numbers of the *Journal* and the *Style Manual for Biological Journals* for detailed instructions concerning the preparation of manuscripts.

REPRINTS: A price list for reprints and an order form are sent with proof. Authors should allow about sixty days after publication for receipt of reprints.

SUBSCRIPTIONS: Annual subscription, \$6.00 (foreign countries, \$6.50). Single numbers, \$1.00. Issued bimonthly, January to November, six issues per volume. *The Ohio Journal of Science* is sent without additional expense to all paid-up members of THE OHIO ACADEMY OF SCIENCE.
