Stewardship of Student Works Task Force Formed

Director of Libraries Carol Diedrichs announced the appointments of several OSUL colleagues to the "Stewardship of Student Works" Task Force.

The group is a task force of the Collection Development and Management Committee and is charged to review existing collections in all formats (print, microforms, electronic) of all thesis, dissertation, and student project content managed by the University Libraries. The task force will develop a plan that addresses:

- reformatting all dissertations and considers the appropriateness of reformatting some or all theses and student project materials,
- implementing appropriate and consistent housing and access policies for reformatted and born digital portions of these collections, and
- implementing appropriate and consistent housing and access policies for print versions of each of these unique components of the Libraries' collections.

[Bebe Miller](#), Distinguished Professor of Arts and Sciences at The Ohio State University, choreographer and dance company director, is a 2012 recipient of the J. Franklin Jameson Archival Advocacy Award given by the Society of American Archivists (SAA). The award honors an individual, institution or organization that promotes greater public awareness, appreciation, or support of archives.



According to the SAA, Miller has shown commitment to the archival preservation of dance through many avenues, such as advocacy within the dance community, organizing workshops on dance archives and documentation, and instituting an archives model to be used by artists.

Miller was nominated for the award by **Nena Couch**, curator of the Lawrence and Lee Theatre Research Institute (TRI), and **Lisa Carter**, associate director for special collections and area studies at The Ohio State University Libraries. Said Couch, “Bebe is inspiring in so many ways – for her creativity, her inquiring mind, and her generosity in sharing her knowledge, both as a teacher, and through archives initiatives. She has assumed an important advocacy role within the field of dance, providing a bridge between archivists and dance creators to explore how best to meet the preservation needs of the field.”

Miller has collaborated with The Ohio State University Department of Dance in producing several digital documented works, a software template for choreographic documentation, and with the Advanced Computing Center for the Arts and Design (ACCAD) to explore the use of motion capture technology for creative and archival purposes. Miller is one of three recipients of the award this year; the others are author and film sleuth Phillip Stewart and freelance writer and New York Times columnist Eve Kahn.

On the award, Miller said, “I am honored to be honored! Having been deeply involved in a two-year conversation with my collaborators about artists’ perspectives on archiving practices, it is very gratifying to know that those outside of our immediate circle understand and appreciate the impulse behind our work. That conversation has produced a new work ([A History](#), premiering at the Wexner Center for the Arts this fall) as well as new questions about how to share the process of dance-making with new audiences.”

In addition to performances of *A History* September 27-30, Miller’s choreographic process is the subject of an exhibition, [Tracing History](#), August 23-September 29 at Ohio State’s Urban Arts Space in downtown Columbus. Her work will also be celebrated in “Dancing Dimensions: Movement through Time and Space,” an exhibition at the OSU Libraries’ Thompson Library Gallery September 5 – December 30.

The **Head of Collection Development and Management Program** is responsible for leading and managing a program to provide a 21st Century research library collection to advance transformative teaching, learning, and research at the University. Exercising collaborative leadership and leveraging a growing portfolio of multi-institutional partnerships and initiatives, the Head is responsible for developing strategy, advising library leaders, making decisions, and creating processes, programs, and projects for the Ohio State University's diverse and extensive print and licensed electronic collections. This is a tenure-track faculty position.

- Leadership - Leads program efforts critical to the Libraries' collection strategies such as building and stewarding distinctive collections, shifting collecting focus from print to electronic resources, periodic and on-going review of continuations, and selection decisions for relocation of print materials and de-duplication. Provides leadership in developing and implementing collecting and fund management strategy in alignment with the Libraries' strategic directions.
- Fund and Budget Management - Facilitates effective use of all funds in a materials budget of over \$14 million.

- Collections Assessment - Develops programmatic capacity to assess collections and usage of print and electronic resources.
- Outreach - Provides effective communications regarding the library's general collections. Leads OSUL participation in the OhioLINK and represents OSU Libraries to CIC partners, CRL, OCLC Research Libraries Partnership, HathiTrust, et al.
- Reporting and Supervision - This position reports to the AD for Collections, Technical Services, and Scholarly Communication. Interviews, hires, develops, supervises and evaluates program staff (currently 1 permanent staff and 1 term staff).
- Scholarship and Service - Builds and maintains a research program and service profile related to library collections. Presents and publishes in appropriate venues in order to raise own and Libraries' profile.
