In view of the intimate association of Charles Dury and Professor J. S. Hine, it seems fitting that we should present together sketches of their life work in Ohio. Both were born, lived, and worked in Ohio. Both were exceptionally successful as field workers in biology, interested in all phases of life and familiar with native plants and animals, but especially birds and insects. Both contributed extensively to the literature of the Ohio fauna, their papers as listed in the Bibliography of the Ohio Zoology, numbering fifty-one for Dury and sixty-three for Hine. Both served as President of the Ohio Academy of Science and Professor Hine was, for many years, the business manager of the Ohio Naturalist and Ohio Journal of Science.
