

## The Preparation of Notes for Publication in The Ohio Journal of Science

Contributions of an abbreviated nature will be published in future numbers of the JOURNAL. These manuscripts, known as "notes," will consist of brief articles which occupy less than a printed page (usually equal to two and one-half double-spaced typewritten pages).

Style will follow that of papers now printed, with the following exceptions:

**Titles** will be located at the beginning of the first paragraph, followed by a period, two spaces, and the first sentence of the text.

**Author's name**, in capital letters and preceded by a dash, will be located at the end of the text, followed by the name and address of the institution. The institution and address will appear in italics and therefore should be underlined.

The literature cited in the text as well as references listed at the end of the note will be treated in the customary manner. These notes will be reviewed by specialists in the area concerned and processed as usual by the editorial staff. It is hoped that by publishing these notes, the JOURNAL will be of even greater service to its readers.
