A. IDENTIFICATION & LOCATION

1. Name

1. 1 Officially named "Halloran House" by Board of Trustees on April 6, 1962. In memory of William I. Halloran.

1.2 Alternate names noted:

Built under architect's project number 6010, which included also Barrett House (184). Name on drawings is "Men's Housing 1# 1 & 2 and Dining Facility." Halloran House was Building 2 of this group. (The dining facility was built later as a separate project--see Building 183.)

The names "Student Housing Unit 2" and "Men's Quadrangle Project No. 1" have been noted.

All of the dormitories north of West Woodruff Avenue are frequently referred to as the "North Dorms."

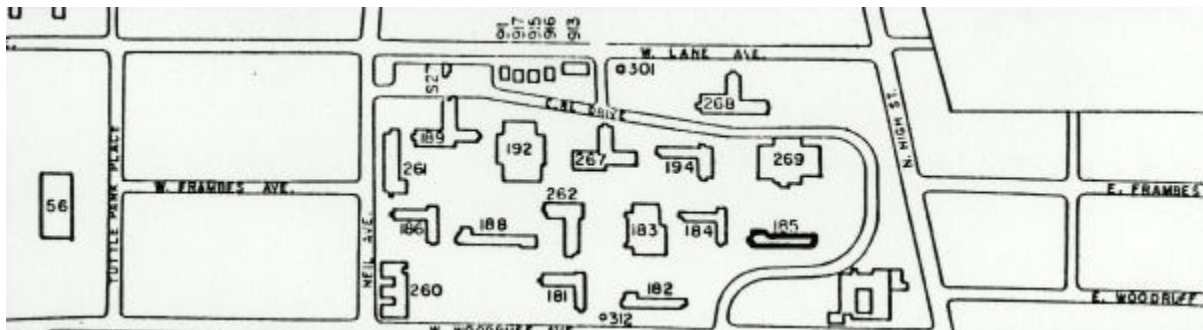

3. General Description

3.1 Type of construction:

Reinforced concrete frame with brick exterior.

3. 2 No. of stories:

Basement and four stories.

3. 3 Increments of construction:

No additions--entire building constructed at one time.

3. 4 Present area of building as shown in inventory records of Division of Campus Planning:

30,988 sq. ft. gross;
18, 458 sq. ft. net assignable

3.5 Volume of building:

266,134 cubic feet (PP)

B. PLANNING & CONSTRUCTION

1. On October 6, 1961 the Board of Trustees approved the plans and related documents prepared by W. E. Linch, University Architect, and authorized the solicitation of bids by contractors.
2. Bids were received on October 30 and November 8, 1961 (T).
3. On November 10, 1961 the Board of Trustees awarded contracts to the following contractors:

General: Baker & Coombs, Inc.

Electrical: Gustav-Hirsch Organization, Inc.

Heating, ventilating, and air conditioning: Tibbetts Plumbing & Heating Co.

Plumbing: Gesling Co.

4. Completion and occupancy:

On July 5, 1963 the Office of Campus Planning issued the initial assignments for use of the space (P),
It was first occupied by students in the Autumn Quarter 1963 (H).

C. COST

Carried in Business Office reports at \$570,321.46.

D. MISCELLANEOUS

From its opening the building has served as a dormitory for male students (H).
