Under the title of H. K. N. we hope to publish in the future issues of *The Ohio State Engineer* a series of articles written by members of Gamma Chapter of Eta Kappa Nu. As far as possible, these contributions will be written about original work or experience of the authors which will be

Eta Kappa Nu is a national honorary electrical engineering fraternity, founded at the University of Illinois, October 28, 1904. The organization has twenty-two active chapters and ten alumni chapters scattered over the country.
