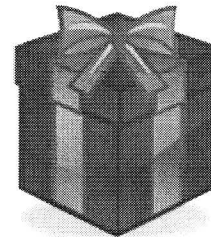

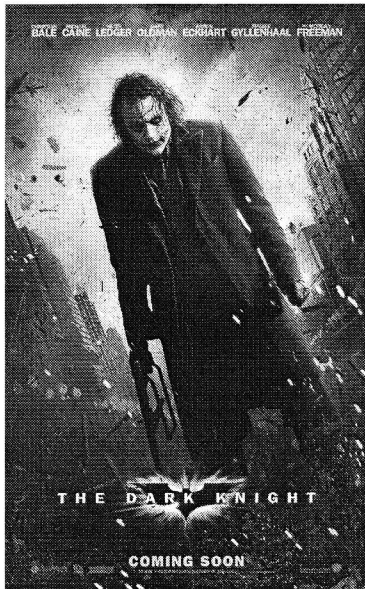

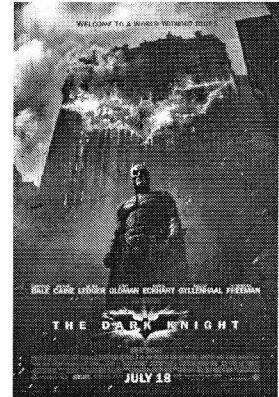

Film in the GA game room
“The Dark Knight”

The Dark Knight is a 2008 American superhero film directed and co-written by Christopher Nolan. Based on the DC Comics character Batman, the film is part of Nolan's *Batman* film series and a sequel to 2005's *Batman Begins*. Christian Bale reprises the lead role. The film follows Bruce Wayne/Batman (Bale), District Attorney Harvey Dent (Aaron Eckhart), and Police Commissioner James Gordon (Gary Oldman) and their struggles and journey in combating

the new threat of the Joker (Heath Ledger). The Joker's identity is left a mystery in the film, while Two-Face's transformation from heroic district attorney to disfigured killer is presented entirely. Nolan's inspiration for the film was the Joker's comic book debut in 1940, and the 1996 series *The Long Halloween*, which re-told Two-Face's origin. *The Dark Knight* was filmed primarily in Chicago, as well as in several other locations in the United States, the United Kingdom, and Hong Kong. Nolan used an IMAX camera to film some sequences, including the Joker's first appearance in the film.

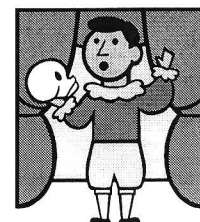

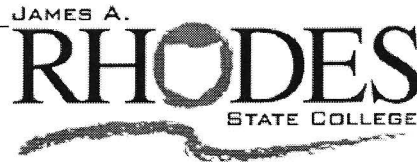

Franklin University Will gladly accept in transfer every credit from an Associate earned at James A. Rhodes State College.

Students can earn their bachelors' degree by combining almost three years of Rhodes State courses with a minimum of 40 semester

credit hours online through Franklin University.

Students can choose from one of our 18 online majors. There is no fee to apply and students will receive a free official transcript evaluation.

The Learning Center (TLC) at Rhodes State College makes a difference!

TLC, under the direction of David Reedy, has peer and professional Learning Assistants (LAs) to support students in progressing through college. This support is made up of guidance for students in taking tests, scheduling time better, enhancing study skills and abilities, and a myriad of other activities. No appointment is necessary to work with a Peer LA (available M-TH from 8-8, F from 8-4, and Sat from 9-2:30) however an appointment is urged if you wish to work with a Professional LA (available M-F 8-4, ask about others).

An old saying, "the proof of the pudding is in the eating" published in *Don Quixote* by Cervantes (1605), identified the tasty outcome of a cooking process; for TLC this was shown when the Higher Learning Commission pointed to our successful support of students as well as the Institutional effect TLC has.

A recent review of grades by students who use TLC showed that 90% of the students who were tutored in CPT106 passed

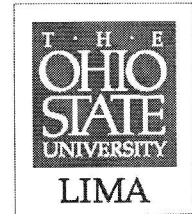
with a B+ or better; 100% of the CPT104 students passed with C or better; 74% of the SDE101 students passed with a B- or better; and nearly 60% of those in writing classes passed with a C or better.

TLC Professional staff members are David Reedy, *Director*; Cristy Vonderembse, *Coordinator Disability Services/Learning Assistance Specialist*; Ashley Niehaus, *Learning Assistance Specialist*; Kathi Butler, *Office Assistant*.

TLC Peer Learning Assistants are Brandon, Mark, Anna, Mary, Micah, Ververde, Sandy, Mary, Amber, Erin, Matt, Nick, Nicolle, Aaron, Eric, Andrea, Heather, and Zach. Also, Lessa and Melissa can provide guidance if you need it.

Remember that we are here with staff learning assistants so come in BEFORE you get into grade trouble and we will help you be part of the nearly 500 students who studied with us last quarter in Science 151, The Learning Center.
