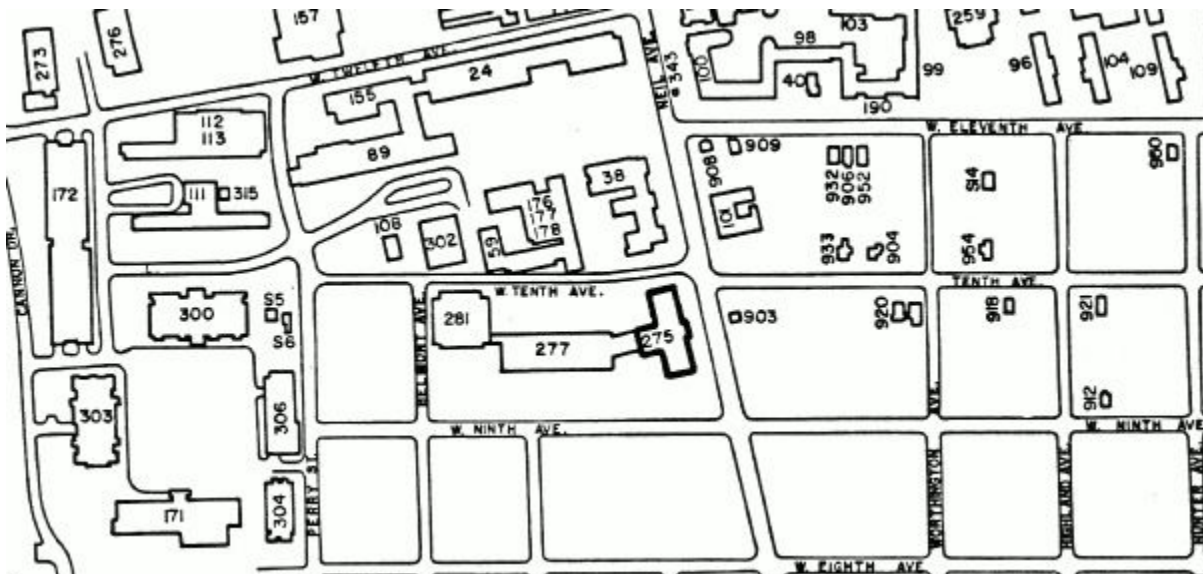

1. On June 9, 1966 the Board of Trustees approved the plans and related documents prepared by Richards Bauer and Moorehead and authorized the solicitation of bids by contractors.

2. Bids were received on July 26, 1966 (T).

3. On September 8, 1966 the Board of Trustees awarded contracts to the following contractors:

General: Garwick and Ross, Inc.

Electrical: S & S Electric Co., Inc.

Heating and air conditioning: Huff'tnan-Wolfe Co.

Plumbing: National Corp.
