## FLUTE AND HARP DUO PRESENT PROGRAM THURSDAY

Jane Berkner, flute, and Tom Bell, harp, will bring their delightful high energy approach to high-brow music to the Auditorium on Thursday, February 23 at noon. Their program will include Andrew Lloyd-Webber, Stephen Foster, and jazz great Paul Desmond as well as classical favorites. Jane Berkner is first flutist with the Ohio Ballet Chamber Orchestra and frequently performs with the Akron and Canton Symphony Orchestras. She holds a Masters of Music from the University of Akron, and is currently on the faculties of Muskingum College and the University of Akron. Harpist Tom Bell began his career as a violinist but loved the sound of the harp so much that he changed the course of his musical life and began studies with Dorothy Henschen at the University of Akron. He spent two summers at the Salzedo Harp Colony in Camden, Maine studying with world famous harpist Alice Chalifoux. He currently performs with the Ohio Ballet Chamber Orchestra. In addition, Tom is a harp technician of national reputation, repairing and maintaining instruments for harpists across the United States.

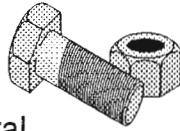
