# Ohio State Lima Graduation and Honors Celebration June 4

The Ohio State University at Lima will honor this year's graduates and present academic achievement awards on Sunday, June 4, at the second annual Graduation and Honors Convocation. The program begins at 1:30, in the Reed Hall Auditorium, preceded by a musical interlude of harp selections performed by Christa Sutherland of Bowling Green State University.

Featured speaker for the Convocation will be Dr. David Hothersall, Professor of Psychology at The Ohio State University at Columbus and Director of the University Honors Program. The Distinguished Alumni Award will be presented to Dr. Margaretha S. Lucas, a graduate of OSU Lima. Dr. Lucas is an Assistant Professor at the University of Maryland at College Park, Maryland, and is a staff psychologist in the University's Counseling and Personnel Services Department. The recipient of the Ohio State Lima Distinguished Teaching Award will also be announced at the Convocation.

Students who have received Associate, Baccalaureate, or Masters degrees from Ohio State Lima in Summer 1994, Fall 1994, Winter 1995 or who will be graduating in Spring 1995 will receive commemorative certificates at the Convocation. Formal graduation ceremonies for Spring graduates will take place at The Ohio State University Stadium in Columbus on Friday, June 9. Academic honor awards in the Arts, Humanities, Natural Sciences, and Social Sciences will be presented to student scholars by their department heads. The Campus Chorus, under the direction of Dr. Richard Mallonee, will present appropriate selections and will lead the assembly in singing "Carmen Ohio." A reception in the Courtyard will follow the program.

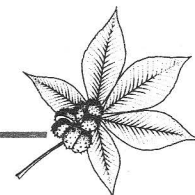

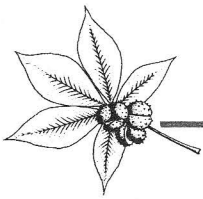
## Study Circles on Racism wins Golden Rule Award

The Study Circles On Racism Volunteer Coalition was one of seven Golden Rule Award Winners, announced April 27. Nineteen individual and group finalists were honored for their exemplary volunteer accomplishments and \$9,750 was presented to the organizations they serve during the seventh annual JCPenney Golden Rule Awards at Veterans Memorial Civic and Convention Center. Seven of the finalists were announced as the Golden Rule Award winners. The winners and benefitting organizations are: Alternative Health Care Clinic, Lima's Samaritan House; Mary Ann Brown, MR Residential Services; Ann R. Fassett, Equestrian Therapy Program; Vera Frankhouser, Lima Memorial Hospital Auxiliary; Robbi Helsler, Youth Winner, American Red Cross and Allen County Teens Improving Our Neighborhoods (ACTION); and Darryl E. Quay, Education Winner, Maplewood Elementary and the Cerebral Palsy Clinic. The winners each received a Waterford Crystal sculpture, signifying the spirit of volunteerism, from Deborah O. Walters, chair of the panel of judges, and a \$1,000 contribution for the non-profit agency they serve from Dennis Morley, manager of JCPenney in the Lima Mall. BP Oil/BP Chemicals Scientist in the Classrooms, Lima City and Allen County Schools, received a runner-up in the education category. A \$250 grant went to the Science Enhancement for Science Advancement (SESA) Program on behalf of the BP Scientists.

Over the past seven years, this volunteer recognition program has received 483 nominations and 130 volunteers and volunteer groups have been honored for their tremendous contributions to the community. In total \$62,500 has been awarded to the volunteer agencies, the winners and runners-up they serve.

All local winners will be entered in the national JCPenney Golden Rule Awards competition where they have the opportunity to earn national recognition and additional grants of up to \$10,000. Last year, Lima's MED-CARE Health Clinic became the first local winner to become a national Golden Rule Award Medallion Winner and received an extra \$5,000.

JCPenney and the United Way of Greater Lima co-sponsor this program with JCPenney covering all expenses and the United Way of Greater Lima providing coordination for the program.



## ***Twelfth Night* centerpiece for Shakespeare festival**

"If music be the food of love, play on..." This famous Shakespearean phrase from *Twelfth Night*, borrowed by musicians and often quoted by scholars, has entertained audiences since its inception and will continue to do so for six performances at OSU-Lima, running May 12-14 and 19-21. *Twelfth Night*, which takes place in Illyria, is a story of intrigue, love, and mistaken identity. Through the antics of a clever set of characters ranging from two fraternal twins, Viola and Sebastian, who are separated by a mishap at sea, to an unusual mix of comical and devious characters, *Twelfth Night* combines a lighthearted, but complex turn of events. Celebrated on the last day of the holiday season extending from Christmas to January 6, the "twelfth night," also known as the "Feast of Fools," commemorates the travels of the Magi to Bethlehem.

Co-directed by Associate Professor of Theatre, Dr. Joe Brandesky and Dr. Maria Ignatieva, Visiting Assistant Professor at the Lima campus, *Twelfth Night* will be part of a series titled, **Shakespeare's Russian Legacy**. Workshops targeted toward junior and senior high school students will bring together aspects of Russian and American perspectives through the common cultural bond provided by the works of William Shakespeare. "Students will be participating in theatre exercises which require them to act out selected scenes from Shakespeare's comedies," said Dr. Ignatieva. "Students will be dancing and learning improvisational skills as well during the 3-hour workshop."

This funny, but often times confusing plot is tied together by the musical and witty words of the jester Feste (played by Dr. Brandesky) who moves among the characters and illuminates the story. "The festive nature of the play lends itself well to music," said Dr. Richard Mallonee, Assistant Professor and musical director for *Twelfth Night*. Live music will accompany each performance. "This gives our students the opportunity to perform challenging literature from the Elizabethan era and they are working diligently to learn the music," said Dr. Mallonee. The performances will be enhanced by a set designed by the world-renowned Jaroslav Malina from Czechoslovakia. Malina will be in residence at OSU-Lima from April 24 to May 15.

An Elizabethan dinner theatre is planned for May 12; the cost is \$25 per person, \$45 a couple. Made possible in part by a grant from the Ohio Joint Program in the Arts and Humanities,

*Twelfth Night* will run May 12, 13, 19, 20 at 8:00pm and May 14 and 21 at 2:00pm in the Reed Hall auditorium on the OSU-Lima campus. Tickets for all performances are \$5.00 adults, \$4.00 students, and \$3.00 seniors and children under 12. For more information or reservations call (419)221-1641, ext. 382.

## **"Music hath charms . . ."**

Live vocal and instrumental music will be featured throughout each *Twelfth Night* production. Each production will include vocal music performed by selected actors. Madrigal Singers, comprised of members of the Lima Campus Chorus, will perform music of Orazio Vecchi, Thomas Morley and John Dowland.

Instrumental selections will be performed by the early music group *Wind in the Woods*. This versatile ensemble will choose to play from various medieval and renaissance instruments including: wooden recorders of various sizes, viola da gamba, lute, crumhorn, and hand drum. The music of the *Wind in the Woods* will also join the festivities during the Elizabethan dinner, May 12, at 6pm.

## **Shakespeare Workshops**

A series of workshops will be conducted in Celebration of the Shakespeare Festival. The first part of the workshops will be dedicated to the historical observation of William Shakespeare's life and creativity. Discussed will be some specific features of the Renaissance. The second part of the workshops will consist of the chance to try some practical theatre exercises. Participants will be asked to act out different scenes from Shakespeare's plays in adaptation. ## **Designing Twelfth Night**

Jaroslav Malina, associate professor of scenography at the Academy of Theatre Art in Prague, Czech Republic, has visited the U.S. five times. He has designed and lectured extensively in Europe and the U.S. including an eight week residency at Nottingham-Trent University in Nottingham, England. His fanciful designs have appeared on stages at the University of Kansas, San Francisco State, and McNeese University in Los Angeles. Recently he was Director General of the Prague Quadrennial, an international exhibition of theatre designers.

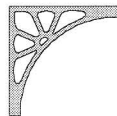
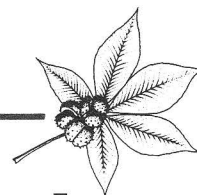
